Science is Shining Bright at Broadway!

Mrs Giles, our Science Lead, has been working hard to develop this important curriculum area since taking responsibility for it in September. She has been working with partners at the Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM) where she is aiming to achieve an award for the work that we are undertaking here at Broadway. With this, staff have been engaged in training, children have been engaging in practical science lessons where they are 'working scientifically' and we have been able to organise a range of science enhancements in school too. This month, we welcomed visitors from Newcastle University and we have also welcomed Y4 families to school where they've been able to see for themselves the learning that is taking place in this subject.

Valentine's Disco

Our Valentine's Disco was a roaring success and raised £314.00 for our school funds. We will be utilising some of this year's fundraising to improve the children's experience of play. Did you know that during a child's time in primary school, on average, they spend 1.4 years of their time at play? We want to make some significant improvements to our playtime provision and your ongoing support for our school events really helps us to bring this about! ©

Once we have made all of the appropriate changes (with the children's help and ideas) we will aim to make this available to more and more children.
