Broadway Remembers





Year 4 & 5 visit the Hancock Museum



Year 4 visited the Great North Museum: Hancock in Newcastle where they took part in a Time Odyssey Quest. After meeting the characters who were lost in time, it was their job to help get them home. The children were fully involved in choosing and analysing museum objects, as well as teamwork, creative activities, photography and discussion. The visit also allowed us to

follow up or recent work on Ancient Greece where we took part in an object eye spy and explored the Ancient Greek gallery.



Year 5 enjoyed an 'out of this world' visit to the Hancock Museum where they visited their planetarium. They had a great time exploring artefacts, whilst completing scavenger hunts in different galleries. The Sun, Stars and Space themed hunt was a favourite for many in Year 5.

The children in year 3 have really enjoyed working with Ashley from Healthy Heads. The sessions used drama, short tasks and games to discuss and explore different feelings and emotions. The children also talked about ways to deal with big emotions.



Outdoor Play and Learning (OPAL)

This term, our pupils have enjoyed expanded play-based learning opportunities during lunchtimes through our Opal Play programme. Our newest addition, *The Broadway Bus*, has brought great excitement to the school yard, with children eagerly exploring its unique space.



The bus is accessible to all year groups and provides opportunities for crosscurricular learning in a fun, relaxed setting. Pupils can cosy up with a book, supporting literacy skills; build imaginative structures with LEGO, fostering problem-solving and spatial awareness; and engage in artistic activities like drawing, colouring, and painting, which develop creativity and fine motor skills. Recently, the children crafted poppies for Armistice Day, linking to



history and citizenship, and proudly decorated the bus to mark this important event. We look forward to bringing holiday cheer to the bus by decorating it for Christmas, providing further opportunities to use their creative and collaborative skills across curriculum areas.



We are also preparing to open our new Loose Parts Zone, which some pupils have already experienced during their afternoon Opal sessions with Mrs. Martin. Take a look at some of our fantastic creations! This type of play is enriching multiple curriculum areas, as pupils become more active while developing essential cooperation, teamwork, and problem-solving skills. Through imaginative building and hands-on

exploration, they engage in activities that enhance their understanding of design and technology, as well as physical development and social skills. These play-based experiences are also helping pupils apply concepts from science and maths as they experiment with structures, balance, and spatial awareness.
