# A Gateway into Governance...

## <u>Meet Fiona Lynn – School Improvement Link Governor</u>

I became a governor at Broadway Junior School in October and have had many opportunities to visit the school since then. It is wonderful to observe the many positive changes that have taken place this year so far. The celebration of children's work in corridors is great to see and a favourite of mine is the new Art Gallery – there are many talented artists in school and the children are very proud of their work.

Playtimes have vastly changed – the investment in outdoor resources and a new play area has certainly been well received by the children! When I spoke with children in school, they excitedly told me that 'There's more than just football now and we get to play with children from other year groups too.' I'm sure that the summer term will be very enjoyable with all of the outdoor activities and games to keep the children active.



Throughout the month of May, some of our fabulous Broadway children have been visiting the Donnison School in the Hendon on a Thursday afternoon to work alongside staff and adults on a historically based music project.

During the visits the children from Year 3, 4 and 5 have had a lot of fun singing shanties and songs and looking at historical figures from the local area, including heroes and villains – some linked to the river and the quayside.

The project also focused on 'intergenerational sharing' through word association and story sharing where the children really enjoyed creating their own Seaside acrostic poem.

## Chess Club – Mrs Hastie

Chess club helps to develop children's strategic thinking and concentration skills. Each week the children learn about a new piece, how it moves and its role in the game. Children play a series of fun mini games involving each piece. By the end of summer term, they will be playing a full game of chess!

#### RE Lessons in Year 3

This term, Louise from Wearside Youth for Christ (WYfC) has been leading some RE lessons, where the children have been learning about the Gospel, also known as the Good News. The Gospel tells the story of Jesus' life and teachings, and it's found in the first four books of the New Testament, written by his disciples Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Year 3 have learned about how Jesus called his first disciples and how Christians today strive to follow Jesus' example. The children have watched videos of the parables 'The Good Samaritan' and 'The Healing of the Leper.' These parables are stories Jesus told with special meanings to help people understand how he wanted them to live.

#### Year 6 explore Islamophobia

Year 6 took part in an Islamophobia assembly which was designed to highlight misconceptions about Muslims and help the children to understand and respect different cultures and religions.

The Islamophobia workshop for our Year 6 children is an important step in promoting understanding, empathy, and inclusion. By educating young minds about the dangers of prejudice and the value of diversity, we can help build a more respectful and harmonious society. Let's work together to create a world where everyone feels valued and accepted.



#### Healthy Heads – Confidence and Resilience Workshops

Year 4 have been working with Ashley from Healthy Heads over the last fortnight. We have been investigating what it means to be confident and resilient. We have learnt about the importance of having a positive mindset and how this can help us try new things.

We have also looked at how we can challenge our negative thoughts and replace them with positive ones!

All the children shared some fantastic ideas and showed great teamwork and kindness to each other! Well done, Year 4!
