#### School Results and Outcomes:

Our Year 4 children this year have achieved the **best multiplication results** that the school has ever seen. I suspect that our outcomes are significantly higher than national averages once they are released – 54% of our children achieved full marks. This is a huge improvement and shows that our standards are consistently rising. Equally, our SATs outcomes showcase that a higher proportion of pupils than ever before are reaching Greater Depth in mathematics – testament to excellent teaching and our ongoing drive for school improvement in this subject!

Thanks to the generous support of the Sir Tom Cowie Charitable Trust, Year 6 pupils were given the opportunity to take part in an educational visit to Lambton Park, a site renowned for its natural

beauty and historical significance.

During the visit, pupils explored the

grounds of Lambton Park, including the impressive Lambton Castle. As part of the experience, they also visited a working horse stable where they observed police horses being trained for operational duties.

In addition, the group received a talk from the estate's Gamekeeper, who provided valuable insights into the local wildlife and tree species found in the area.



The primary aim of the visit was to enhance pupils' understanding of the history of Lambton Castle while raising aspirations and fostering an appreciation for the surrounding natural environment.
