

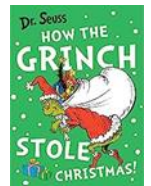
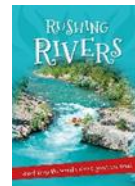
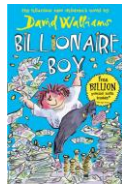
Termly Learning Leaflet

This term, in Year 4, we will be reading...



Reading

In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 – 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will receive homework each Monday to be returned the following Monday. Homework may be set using an online platform such as Purple Mash. Children are expected to complete weekly tasks on Times Tables Rock Stars. All work will be explained and discussed in class before coming home; it may be a continuation of classwork, or a task to consolidate learning. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time. The children will also receive a half termly spelling list. Spellings are tested every Friday.

PE in Year 4

Children in Year 4 will participate in P.E on **Wednesdays**, your child will need to arrive in school wearing their kit. PE lessons will take place inside and out, dependent on the weather so your child's choice of kit should reflect this. Trainers will be required for all pupils, with black tracksuit bottoms, shorts or joggers (leggings for the girls) along with their regular uniform top (or white t-shirt).

Our Curriculum in Year X this term...

In reading we will...
Investigate features of a text and how they affect the reader.
In writing we will...
Plan and write our own version of a familiar story with a focus on varied and rich vocabulary.
In mathematics we will...
Add and subtract numbers with up to three digits using a formal written method exchanging as required. Read, write, order and round 4-digit numbers. Calculate the Perimeter of 2d shapes. Know all x tables.
In science we will...
Recognise that sounds are made through vibrations. Find patterns with pitch and volume. Construct a simple electrical circuit. Recognise that a switch closes a circuit. Recognise common conductors and insulators
In RE we will...
Research the 'Trinity' and why it is so important to Christians and how Christians show their beliefs about God the Trinity in worship. Discover what Hindus believe god is like.
In history and geography we will...
Research and study Ancient Greek life, achievements and their influence. Understand the key elements and features of a river and to know the names and key information of the world's main rivers.
In PE we will...
Work on jumping, landing, co-ordination and footwork skills. Persevere with a task and improve performances through regular repetition.
In music we will...
Listen to music with pentatonics. Play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and 5 note pentatonic scales. Create soundscapes linked to different pieces of music.
In art and DT we will...
Explore how different materials can be shaped and joined and create our own 3D sculptures. We will also investigate a range of pencil cases before designing, making and evaluating one of our own.
In French we will...
Learn how to introduce ourselves to others and talk about ourselves and our families.
In computing we will...
Develop coding skills, ensuring pupils have the opportunity to explore program design and put computational thinking into practice.
In PSHE/RSHE we will...
Discuss the meaning of healthy lifestyles and how our bodies change. Build an awareness of online safety and the benefits and risks of sharing information online.
