

My Happy Mind

This half term's theme has been 'Meet the Brain'

We are thrilled to announce that we are now a 'My Happy Mind' School. My Happy Mind is an NHS backed programme that gives children the tools they need to build resilience and self-esteem.

We got off to a flying start in the first week back with our first unit: Meet Your Brain. This unit explains the three parts of the brain and what they are responsible for. Children have engaged in happy breathing and have already started to learn how to journal purposefully. In the coming weeks we will be looking closely for some 'Happiness Heroes' so watch this space! Researchers found outdoor play had a positive effect on children's social-emotional skills, meaning they were better able to understand, manage and express their emotions and behaviours, as well as interact with the world around them and build relationships.



Our play provision continues to thrive where we endeavor for everyone to have a Positive Playtime each and every day!



We are pleased to share that we have been able to donate much of it to a charity supporting a project in Gambia – our donation has truly helped those who do not benefit from the same educational privileges that we have here in the UK. So often it is taken for granted... it has been lovely to receive appreciation, included below:



Dear Mr Walton Jonas,

On behalf of Project Gambia, I would like to express our heartfelt thanks for your generous donation of classroom furniture. The items have been collected and will be shipped to The Gambia in October where they will be used to refurbish Sheik Hatab primary school in Gunjur village.

We visited this school in January this year and saw first-hand the desperate need for a full refurbishment of the building. In March next year, a team of 30 volunteers from Sunderland will travel out to Gambia to repair, redecorate and equip the building with the furniture kindly donated by your school.

Your contribution will undoubtedly transform their learning environment and provide them with dignity and comfort they deserve when attending school.

Project Gambia was established in 2010 and since then more than thirty groups of volunteers have travelled to Gunjur, forging strong community and school links with the support of the Gunjur Project Association. Your donation continues this legacy of solidarity and practical support.

Following our next volunteer trip we will forward photographs of the refurbishment so that your pupils can see the difference the furniture from their school has made. You can follow the work we do on our Project Gambia Facebook page.

Classroom Behaviour Charts explained...

CLASSROOM CHART	DEFINITION	FOLLOW UP / ACTION
	<p>Outstanding</p> <p>Children will be moved to 'Outstanding' who have demonstrated exemplary behaviour which may have resulted in an outstanding piece of work or attitude to learning.</p>	An Outstanding certificate will be awarded in our weekly celebration assembly.
	<p>Great Work</p> <p>Children will be moved to 'Great Work' when they consistently work hard, display good manners and do their best.</p>	<p>Verbal feedback in class – positive praise and possibly a positive point, if required.</p> <p>Peg is moved up from Ready to Learn.</p>
	<p>Ready to Learn</p> <p>Children will start each day on 'Ready to learn'. They are expected to follow our rules and values as every child has a right to access their education without disruption.</p>	All children will begin each day at this stage.
	<p>Reminder</p> <p>Issued for: low level disruptions, not listening in class, shouting out, being out of seat without a valid reason, etc.</p>	<p>Verbal reminder given.</p> <p>Opportunities given to correct the behaviour.</p> <p>Follow up with positives, where relevant.</p> <p>Should little/no improvement be made, the child will move down.</p>
	<p>Warning</p> <p>Issued for: Ignoring the reminder, persistently off-task, talking in class and disrupting learning, etc. At this point, children are given the opportunity to make up for lost learning during break times.</p>	<p>Warning marked on the teacher's class chart – monitored by Senior Leaders in school.</p> <p>Loss of 5 minutes at break time to complete missed work/discuss, in private, if relevant.</p>
	<p>Red Card</p> <p>Issued for: being disrespectful to staff, use of foul or derogatory language, refusal to comply with a warning, displaying verbal or physical aggression or any form of bullying. A sanction will be put in place.</p>	<p>Matter passed to a senior leader and recorded on our tracking systems.</p> <p>Loss of minutes (to be determined by the seriousness of the incident).</p> <p>Opportunities to repair the relationship between staff member/other children.</p> <p>Discussion with the family on collection or via telephone/text message, if required.</p>
