Reading

In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 – 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. **Anyone who does this regularly will be entered into our reading reward extra break time treat each half term!** Reading records are to be returned every Monday morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will receive homework each Monday to be returned the following Monday. Homework may be set using an online platform such as Purple Mash or Times Tables Rock Stars. The work will be explained and discussed in class before coming home; it may be a continuation of classwork, or a task to consolidate learning. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time.

PE in Year 4

Children in Year 4 will participate in P.E on **WEDNESDAY**, your child will need to arrive in school wearing their kit. PE lessons will take place inside and out, dependent on the weather so your child's choice of kit should reflect this. Trainers will be required for all pupils, with black tracksuit bottoms, shorts or joggers (leggings for the girls) along with their regular uniform top (or white t-shirt).

Our Curriculum in Year 4 this term...

In reading we will...
Explain the meaning of words in more than one context. Identify techniques writers use to create mood and atmosphere.
In writing we will...
Plan and write a longer story including details of setting using figurative language to evoke mood and atmosphere. Write a report with a clear audience and specific form.
In mathematics we will...
Understand patterns in Times tables. Be able to multiply and divide numbers using written methods. Gain an understanding of Co-ordinates and position. Calculate using fractions.
In science we will...
Understand the functions of the digestive system in humans and animals and how food chains work. Learn about states of matter. Compare and group materials together, according to solids, liquids or gases.
In Computing we will...
Learn how to use digital animation and understand computer systems and networks. Internet safety focus on Online Reputation, Online Bullying and Self-Image & Identity.
In PE we will...
Learn the skills of Coordination, sending and receiving and balance.
In Geography we will...
Recognise where Rainforests are in the world and how they are made up. Understand how deforestation is impacting the environment.
In History we will...
Learn about The Roman Empire and what happened when the Romans occupied Britain.
In French we will...
Explore the traditional story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and retell it in French.
In Art we will...
Continue our work on 3D sculptures then look at textures, fabrics, shapes, colours and moods with links to our rainforest topic.
In Music we will...
Use instruments to create sounds with a focus on playing a Ukulele Create music that describes contrasting moods.
In PSHE/RSHE we will...
Understand what it means to be living in the wider world and respecting the views of others. Learning what being part of a community means.
