


Values and Vision



BOYS


- White polo shirt

The children are awarded positive points when they demonstrate our School Motto



Reading



At Broadway Junior School, children are encouraged to develop a love for learning through rich, engaging texts and can access a wide range of quality texts in an engaging learning environment.

Your children access our wide selection of books which are linked to Accelerated Reader. Children are assessed regularly and they can choose from a variety of books at their reading level.

In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 - 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning.

Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home. Reading with children every day and talking to them about a wide variety of books, helps them to develop a love of books and a varied vocabulary.

Things you can do to support your child at home.

Look at the book first, talking about what you can see happening in the pictures.

Try to predict the story and possible unknown words.

Your child will know how to blend sounds when reading. However, words such as was are a little trickier as sounding them out does not work. The children just need to learn how they look.

Look out for words they already know within longer words eg: dustbin.


Remind children to think about how speech might be said to encourage them to read with expression.

Punctuation helps your child to read with intonation and brings a book to life.


Question your child about events in the book to check that they have understood what they are reading.


Encourage your child to refer to words and passages in the text to justify opinions








Mathematics


- Fluency in number can children quickly recall number facts, at speed, with 'automaticity'?
- E.G: 3 + 4 = 7 so 30 + 40 = 70 and 300 and 400 = 700
- E.G:
- $2 \times 3 = 6 \text{ so}$
- $6 \div 3 = 2$
- Times Tables knowing all multiplication facts, by heart, by Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC).
- Telling the time

• Children will receive 10 minutes online times tables homework each Monday to be completed by 7:30pm the following Sunday evening. Little and often is the key.



- Spellings will be taught and practiced every day in early bird then tested on a Friday morning.

Curriculum



In reading we will...

Explore a range of texts and the vocabulary used by the author to convey a character's thoughts and feelings. Study basic play scripts and identify features such as stage directions.

In writing we will...

Write character and setting descriptions using expanded noun phrases. Retell a familiar story. Begin to use inverted commas to show when someone is speaking. Write a non-chronological report linked to an area of our curriculum.

In mathematics we will...

Add and subtract numbers which bridge across 10. Count and compare numbers to 1,000 and add and subtract within 1,000 using known facts. Measure and read scales using mm/cm, g/kg and ml/l. Make simple conversions between measurements eg 250cm = 2m 50cm. Identify right angles in a range of shapes. Learn the 10 and 5 times tables.

In science we will...

Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition. Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

Observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and identify some magnetic materials. Describe magnets as having 2 poles. Predict whether 2 magnets will attract or repel.

In history we will...

Look at Stone Age society, animals, housing, food and inventions. Consider land use and areas of settlements induding shifting continents. Study inventions from the Stone Age to Iron Age in Ancient Britain.

In geography we will...

Study Rio and South East Brazil. We will learn the location and human/physical features of Rio de Janeiro and South-East Brazil, as a region in The Americas. Children will compare these new places with places they are familiar with. In computing we will...

Learn to log onto our school computer system and access the online platforms that we use for homework and teadring such as Times Tables Rockstars, Sumdog and Purple Mash. We will develop touch typing skills and learn to recognize cyber bullying.

In RE we will...

Explore the Christian creation story as well as learning about the Festivals of Harvest, Advent and Christmas.

In art we will...

Mix and use paints to create prehistoric paintings linked to our stone age history topic.

In DT we will...

Investigate a range of packages used for different purposes. Design and make our own packaging using the skills of scoring, cutting, joining and strengthening.

In music we will...

Take part in weekly glockenspiel lessons with a music tutor learning basic rhythm and notation skills. Listen to and appraise a range of musical genres.


In PSHE/RSHE we will...

Learn how to keep ourselves safe near roads and online. Learn what to do in an emergency including some basic first aid skills. Learn how to look after our physical and mental health.

Curriculum enrichment

We hope to plan an educational visit for each term to support our history and/or science curriculum. Details to follow.






Celebration Assembly

- 1 x attendance award from the whole school


The highest attending class from that week also get to 'spin the wheel' for an extra treat such as active trail time, parachute games, colouring in.
