

- Smart, sensible black shoes


BOYS

Attendance

Our goal is for all pupils to meet a target of 97 - 100% attendance.

At Broadway Junior School we ensure that every member of the school community feels valued and respected, and that each person is treated fairly and well. Every child has a peg on the behaviour chart and can move up or down depending on their behaviour and attitude.

The children collect these points and will be awarded certificates in our celebration assembly each week: Bronze for 25 positive points, Silver for 50 positive points, Gold for 75 positive points and platinum for 100 positive points.

Reading



At Broadway Junior School, children are encouraged to develop a love for learning through rich, engaging texts and can access a wide range of quality texts in an engaging learning environment. Your children access our wide selection of books which are linked to Accelerated Reader. Children are assessed regularly and they can choose from a variety of books at their reading level.


In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 – 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning. Our school is using the **Reading Plus** program to help your child become a better reader. Reading Plus helps develop the skills children need to be proficient readers and lifelong learners. Through regular Reading Plus practice, reading will become easier, comprehension will increase, and your child will make meaningful connections between reading and learning. Your child will complete two sessions in school, but we encourage them to complete three more Reading Plus assignments outside of school on a computer or tablet with Internet access. This can contribute to their home reading recordings

Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home. Reading with children every day and talking to them about a wide variety of books, helps them to develop a love of books and a varied vocabulary.

Beamish Visit : Wednesday 2nd October 2024




The day trip to Beamish is an annual visit for Year 6 pupils at Broadway - and each year all staff and pupils make the effort to 'dress' as if they were from this period in history. We are therefore hoping this year will follow suit; the children are invited to **dress as World War 2 evacuees**.

Examples of outfits would be: **Boys:** flat cap, waistcoat, jumper, trousers. **Girls:** head scarf, dress or dungarees, shawl. The Internet will also give you some excellent ideas for outfits.


