





This term, in Year 5, we will be reading...











Reading

In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 - 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will receive homework each Monday to be returned the following Monday. Homework will usually be set using an online platform such as Purple Mash, Sumdog or Times Tables Rock Stars. The work will be explained and discussed in class before the children leave school; it may be a continuation of classwork, or a task to consolidate learning. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time.

Spellings

In order for you to support your child at home, the children will receive a half termly spelling list. Spellings are tested every Friday.

PE in Year 5

Classes **5ZG** and **5GR** will participate in P.E on **Thursdays**. Your child will need to arrive in school wearing their kit. PE lessons will take place inside and out, dependent on the weather so your child's choice of kit should reflect this. Trainers will be required for all pupils, with black tracksuit bottoms, shorts or joggers (leggings for the girls) along with their regular uniform top (or white t-shirt).

Swimming

This term, children in **5ES** will participate in swimming at Sandhill View Academy on **Wednesdays**. On the day of their session, they should bring swimwear, a towel and a swimming hat.

Our Curriculum in Year 5 this term...

In reading we will...

Scan a text to identify a word or phrase from reading and give alternative meaning for it. Identify language, including figurative language the writer has chosen for impact and discuss and evaluate the impact on the reader. Provide reasons for views about texts read. Deduce characters' thoughts, feelings and motives for their actions. Identify and discuss writer technique such as repetition, recap, alliteration, onomatopoeia to create a specific effect such as humour and suspense. Identify techniques, sentence structure and language techniques that supports precise and concise presentation of information in report writing.

In writing we will...

Plan and tell a story demonstrating awareness of audience by using techniques such as recap, repetition, humour or suspense. Plan, compose, edit and perform a poem/poems focusing on projecting their voice to a large audience. Ensure features of a specific type of poem are applied and language and grammatical features are used appropriately. Write in the style of a particular author, organised into chapters, extend ways to link paragraphs using adverbs and adverbial phrases. Practise writing a recount with a specific form and audience with a word limit so that pupils are forced to consider the precise level of formality required.

In mathematics we will...

Recognise obtuse and right angles. Learn to read and plot coordinates on a graph. Recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths. Find the effect of dividing a one- or two-digit number by 10 and 100. Round decimals with one decimal place to the nearest whole number. Solve problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places. To become competent in multiplying and dividing numbers up to 4 digits by a one or two digit number, using short multiplication, long multiplication and short division. Recalling of times table facts and relating division facts to 12x12.

In science we will...

Describe the movement of the Earth, moon and other planets. Describe the sun, Earth and moon as approximately spherical bodies. Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night. Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity. Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction.

In RE we will...

Explore what does it mean if Christian's believe that God is loving and Holy. Learn what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today.

In geography we will...

Children will learn the names and locations of the world's principal mountains, volcanoes and areas at risk from earthquakes; the main features and types of mountains; how some people have adapted to life in mountainous areas.

In history we will...

Learn why, where and when the Scots and Anglo-Saxons invaded. Britain, what can be learnt about them from the Sutton Hoo burial and all about Saxon Britain.

In music we will...

Children will continue to learn how to play simple melodies using a ukulele.

In art we will...

Be developing our drawing skills through the theme of space.

In DT we will...

Children will investigate toys with moving cam mechanisms. Look at cam mechanisms and construction. Design a toy that includes a cam mechanism in its design.

In computing we will...

Children will learn about computing systems & networks systems. Children will work towards creating their own game using code. Online safety and wellbeing will include themes such as online reputation, self-image and identity and online bullying.

In French we will...

Learn new vocabulary to describe family. Children will also learn days of the week, months and numbers in order to write the date in French.

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In PSHE/RSHE we will...

Safety and the changing body will make up Autumn curriculum. Children will learn to be safe online, changes about their body, including staying healthy. A focus on wellbeing will be throughout alongside discreet lessons. We teach a reactive curriculum and include current/ important topics throughout the term.

In PE we will...

The children will develop and apply their ball skills and reaction and response through focused skill development sessions, modified/non-traditional games and sports and healthy competition. When Swimming, children will use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke. The children will learn, develop and apply all gym skills on the floor, with hand apparatus and on low apparatus through focused skill development, sequence creation and games.
