'Attendance is Everyone's Business'

Our attendance traffic light system:

<p>Less than 90%</p> <p>Serious Concern</p> <p>Immediate Improvement Required</p>	<p>Your child is classed as a '<u>persistent absentee</u>' and is missing a significant amount of school which could affect their learning, life chances and their ability to establish and maintain friendships in school.</p> <p>If your child's attendance stays at this level they will have missed at least 4 weeks of lessons by the end of the year.</p>
<p>90-95%</p> <p>Worrying</p> <p>Improvement Needed</p>	<p>Your child is at risk of missing important parts of the curriculum which could significantly affect their learning.</p> <p>If your child's attendance stays at this level they could have missed between 1-4 weeks by the end of the school year.</p>
<p>96-100%</p> <p>Excellent</p>	<p>Outstanding!</p> <p>No action required.</p> <p>Your child has the best opportunity to reach their full potential.</p>
