Fixed Penalty Notices for irregular attendance at school

Important information for parents

1 OVERVIEW

Regular school attendance is vital for children to reach their full potential. If your child is absent for any reason, it is important that you communicate fully with the school. However new national guidance is to be implemented from September to manage irregular attendance at school.

Penalty notices are issued as an alternative to prosecution where parents have failed to ensure their child attends school regularly. They can be used in cases where absence has not been authorised by a head teacher and can be in respect of any unauthorised absence, irrespective of reason.

The notices are used to prevent the need for court action, for example, when support has not been engaged with or is not appropriate (for example, leave of absence during term time).

Changes from September 2024 are shown →

2 LEAVE

Head Teachers are unable to grant leave of absence during term time unless there are **exceptional circumstances**.

Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation **would not** constitute an exceptional circumstance.

3 ABSENCE

A Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued if there are **5 days / 10 sessions** of absence in a period of **10 school weeks** (where absence has not been authorised).

A notice may be issued where the 5-day level of consecutive absence has not been reached, for example, if there are several periods of leave.

4 AMOUNT

The **first** penalty notice is **£160** if paid within 28 days, reduced to **£80** if paid within 21 days.

A **second** penalty notice is **£160** to be paid within 28 days.

A **third** penalty notice cannot be issued. **Legal action** may result (for example, prosecution).

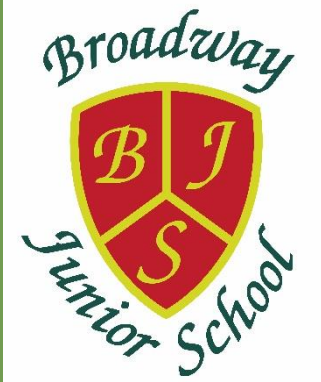

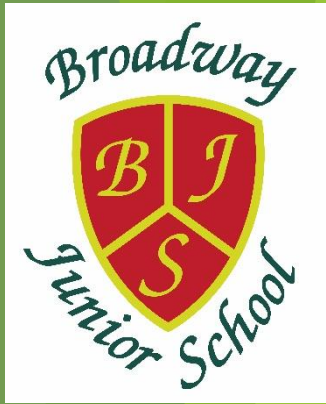

Parent Code of Conduct



Educating children is a process that involves a strong partnership between parents, class teachers and the school community. For these reasons we understand the importance of good working relationships and we continue to welcome and encourage parents/carers to participate fully in the life of our school. The purpose of this guidance is to provide a reminder to all parents, carers and visitors to our school about the expected conduct. This is so we can make sure that all children who attend Broadway Junior School can make good progress and achieve in a positive atmosphere of mutual understanding.

We expect parents, carers and visitors to:

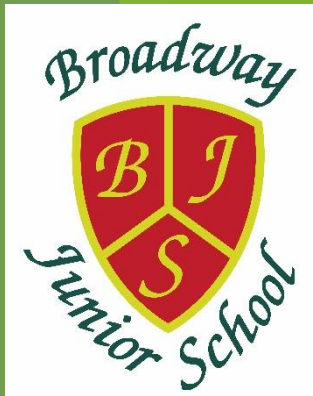
- Understand that both teachers and parents need to work together for the benefit of their children.
- Demonstrate that all members of the school community should be treated with respect and therefore set a good example in their own speech and behaviour.
- Seek to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view in order to bring about a peaceful solution to any issue.
- Approach the school to help resolve any issues of concern.

In order to support a peaceful and safe school environment the school cannot tolerate parents, carers and visitors exhibiting the following:

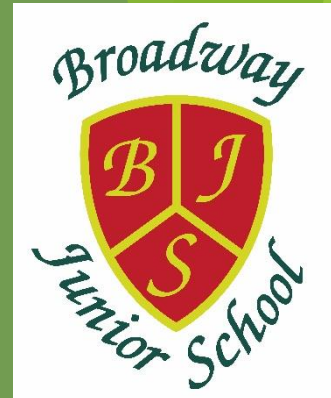
- Defamation of either the good reputation of the school or any member of school staff on 'Facebook' or other social sites.
- Disruptive behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with the operation of any area of the school, including the school yard and school grounds, whenever the school is in use.
- Using loud/or offensive language, swearing, cursing, using profane language or displaying temper.
- Threatening to do actual bodily harm to a member of school staff, visitor, fellow parent/carer or child regardless of whether or not the behaviour constitutes a criminal offence.
- Damaging or destroying school property.
- Abusive or threatening emails or text/voicemail/phone messages or other written communication.
- The use of physical aggression towards another adult or child. This includes physical punishment against your own child on school premises.
- Approaching someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of the actions towards their own child. (Such an approach to a child may be seen to be an assault on that child and may have legal consequences.)
- Dogs must not be brought on to the school premises.

Should any of the above behaviour occur, the school may feel it is necessary to contact the appropriate authorities and seek legal advice, and if necessary, ban the offending adult from entering the school grounds.

We trust that parents and carers will assist our school with the implementation of this policy and we thank you for your continuing support of the school.

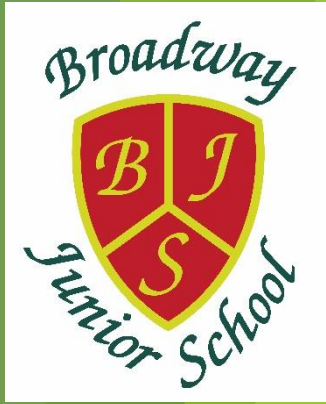

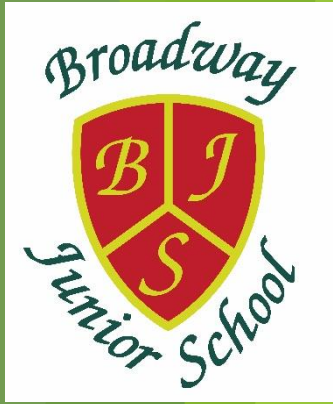

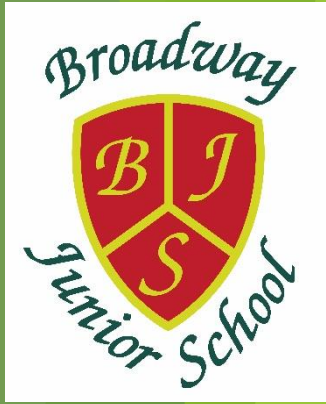
Reading

At Broadway Junior School, children are encouraged to develop a love for learning through rich, engaging texts and can access a wide range of quality texts in an engaging learning environment.

Your children access our wide selection of books which are linked to Accelerated Reader. Children are assessed regularly and they can choose from a variety of books at their reading level.

The children will bring books home to share, please make use of our Reading Record Books. Reading with children every day and talking to them about a wide variety of books, helps them to develop a love of books and a varied vocabulary.

There are many things that you can do to support your child at home!



Mathematics

- ▶ Fluency in number – can children quickly recall number facts, at speed, with 'automaticity'?
- ▶ E.G: $3 + 4 = 7$ so $30 + 40 = 70$ and $300 + 400 = 700$
- ▶ E.G:
 $2 \times 3 = 6$ so $6 \div 3 = 2$
- ▶ Times Tables – knowing all multiplication facts, by heart, by Year 4 – Multiplication Tables Check (MTC).

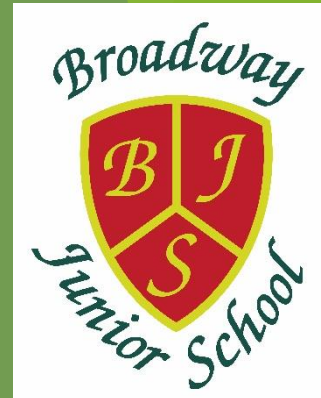

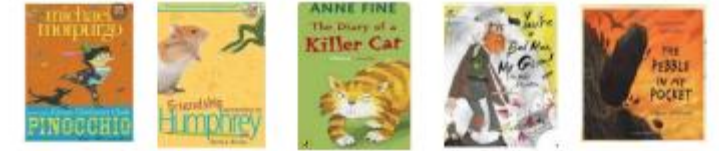

This term, in Year 3, we will be reading...



Reading

In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 – 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every **Monday** morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will have homework on Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) each Monday. This will need to be completed by the children at home. The children will need to complete 10 garage games each week; this is equal to a total of 10 minutes. It is more beneficial to complete 2 or 3 minutes over several days rather than 10 minutes all at once. We really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time. We support with logging onto TTRS please don't hesitate to ask. Children should have also brought their spelling book for the half term. These will be practiced in class throughout the week and tested on a Friday, but any additional learning of these spellings at home would be extremely helpful for your child.

PE in Year 3

Children in Year 3 will participate in P.E on **Wednesday** (NOTE: This is a change of day from last term). They will also be participating in a yoga session every **Friday**. Your child will need to arrive in school wearing their kit. PE lessons will take place inside and out, dependent on the weather so your child's choice of kit should reflect this. Trainers will be required for all pupils, with black tracksuit bottoms, shorts or joggers/leggings along with their regular uniform top (or white t-shirt).

5 Ways to Wellbeing

With the summer months approaching, we are hoping to make the most of some warmer weather and spend more time learning outdoors. We will be enhancing our science topic by planting a range of flowers and vegetables in the school grounds.

Curriculum Enrichment – Our Plans...

As part of our history and art topics, we will be studying the coal mining heritage of Sunderland. As well as speaking to a former coal miner, we hope to participate in a visit to either Sunderland or Woodhorn Museum.

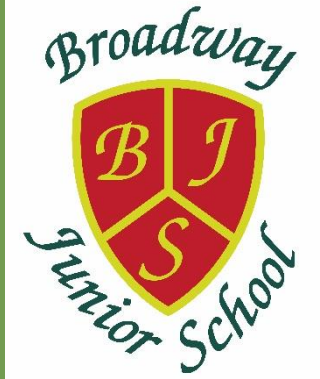
After School Clubs
