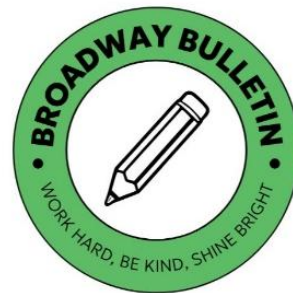

This year's Year 6 results are also the **best** we have seen in years and significantly higher than National Averages in all subjects! **Amazing!**
