

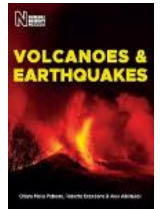
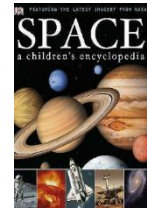
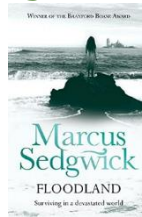
Termly Learning Leaflet

This term, in Year 5, we will be reading...



Reading

In order to reinforce learning, your child will be given a reading record book. Reading is exceptionally important and it is imperative that children are reading regularly, hopefully for 10 – 15 minutes at least 5 times per week. It would be really helpful if you could listen to your child read and record this in their home reading record. Reading records are to be returned every Monday morning. Children will bring a book home from school, but they are also quite welcome to read any books or magazines they have at home.

Homework Expectations at Broadway Junior School

Children will receive homework each Monday to be returned the following Monday. Homework may be set using an online platform such as Purple Mash or Times Tables Rock Stars. The work will be explained and discussed in class before coming home; it may be a continuation of classwork, or a task to consolidate learning. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child completes and returns their homework on time. In order for you to support your child at home, the children will receive a half termly spelling list. Spellings are tested every Friday.

5 Ways to Wellbeing

Anti-bullying week will be celebrated in school on 16th November, where the children will take part in a range of different activities during this week. Children will also take part in My Happy Mind lessons on Mondays.

RHE (Relationships & Health Education)

Our Curriculum in Year 5 this term...

In reading we will...
Scan a text to identify a word or phrase from reading and give alternative meaning for it. Identify language, including figurative language the writer has chosen for impact and discuss and evaluate the impact on the reader. Deduce characters' thoughts, feelings and motives for their actions. We will focus on vocabulary and aim to strengthen our knowledge in this area.
In writing we will...
Plan and tell a story demonstrating awareness of audience by using techniques such as recap, repetition, humour or suspense. Plan, compose, edit and perform a poem focusing on projecting their voice to a large audience. Write in the style of a particular author, organised into chapters, extend ways to link paragraphs using adverbs and adverbial phrases.
In mathematics we will...
Recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths. Find the effect of dividing a one- or two-digit number by 10 and 100. To become competent in multiplying and dividing numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number, using short multiplication, long multiplication and short division.
In science we will...
Describe the movement of the Earth, moon and other planets. Describe the sun, Earth and moon as approximately spherical bodies. Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night. Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity. Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction.
In R.E we will...
Explore what does it mean if Christians believe that God is loving and Holy. Learn what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today.
In geography we will...
Children will learn the names and locations of the world's principal mountains, the main features and types of mountains and how some people have adapted to life in mountainous areas.
In history we will...
Learn why, where and when the Scots and Anglo-Saxons invaded Britain, what can be learnt about them from the Sutton Hoo burial site and all about life in Saxon Britain.
In music we will...
Year 5 pupils to develop skills in singing in parts, listening closely to others, exploring sound sources, and composing short musical pieces.
In art we will...
Using 'Retro Futurism' and illustrations of Space and the future, Children will explore a range of Art work to create their own compositions using a range of different mediums.
In D.T we will...
Children will explore cooking and nutrition with the outcome of developing a recipe
In computing we will...
Internet safety: Lessons will help children make responsible choices about their online identity, communicate safely and positively in online communities, evaluate online information critically, and recognize when to support others or seek help from a trusted adult. Word Processing and Game creator: Children learn essential document editing and formatting skills using Microsoft Word to create their own text documents. They also explore game design by using 2DIY3D to build 3D maze adventure games and evaluate each other's work.
In French we will...
Children will learn days of the week, months and numbers in order to write the date in French. We will also learn vocabulary to discuss our pets.
In PSHE/RSHE we will...
How can I support my mind and body as I grow? Children will learn to be safe online, changes about their body, including staying healthy. WE will also discuss why healthy relationships are important. A focus on wellbeing will be throughout alongside discreet lessons.
In PE we will...
The children will develop and apply their ball skills and reaction and response through focused skill development sessions, modified/non-traditional games and sports and healthy competition. When Swimming, children will use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.
